Spartanburg

Throughout downtown Spartanburg's Cultural District, Ongoing - The Creative Crosswalk Project is a public art initiative in which local artists and designers design and paint a series of crosswalk murals, transforming the crosswalks into works of art, on Main Street in Spartanburg, SC. The downtown cultural district area is often bustling with events and pedestrians, and the pedestrians rely heavily on a multitude of crosswalks to safely traverse the downtown Spartanburg area. The problem is that crosswalks are incredibly easy to overlook, they are rarely visually appealing, and they can even be quite dangerous. In an effort to remedy these issues, Chapman Cultural Center, the City of Spartanburg, and the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce came together to organize the Creative Crosswalk Project. Artists Collective | Spartanburg (formerly West Main Artists Cooperative), 578 West Main St., Spartanburg. **Nov. 3 - 28** - "Etched in Stone," features some-18 prints by Spartanburg photographer John Lever, who will exhibit a striking collection of photography. Guests are required to wear face masks and to physically distance themselves. Because of the pandemic, the gallery will not hold a reception, and it will not participate in the city's monthly ArtWalk. "This is an exhibition that was originally scheduled for the spring," the Collective's Management Board Chair Beth Regula said. "That was about the time the pandemic hit, and everything was either cancelled or delayed. I am so glad that we are able to now bring this wonderful photography to the viewing public. John has captured a sense of awe and wonder in his

photos of the American West. The landscape out west is very different from what we are accustomed to here in the South. It's almost otherworldly." **Nov. 3 - 28** - "O: The Other Side," a paint and digital fusion art exhibition featuring works by Roderice Cardell (THEMADDDART-IST) is a member of the Collective, a resident of Spartanburg, and his medium for this show is mostly digital collages. Evan Givens (SadGod) is a guest artist, a resident of Greenville, and his medium is photography. Their joint exhibition is thematically about the human experience with emphasis on acceptance, struggling, frustration, and technology. Each artist has five works in the exhibit, as well as five works that they created together. **Nov. 3 - Dec. 26** - "Holiday Artisan Market," featuring and selling locally made art, specially curated for gift giving. Guests will be required to wear face masks and to be socially distant as they peruse the works in clay, photography, painting, mixed media, jewelry, glass, and other products of creative expression. In all, 37 Collective members will have their work in the Market. Prices will range from items under \$5 to more than \$1,000. **Ongoing** - The Collective features a twenty thousand square foot facility offering affordable studio space, retail space, three galleries, a full ceramics studio, printery, and works by 50 local artists.
