Artisans will be on hand selling original handcrafted wares, authors will host book signings, and door prizes will be given away throughout the day. From 10am until 4pm, visitors will enjoy free admission and trolley service to convenient parking.

If you enjoy using your art objects daily, a talented group of potters has been assembled to include Clay Impressions of Heath Springs, SC, Red Hare of Seagrove, NC, Blue Hare Pottery and Glazed Expressions of Rock Hill, SC, and Oak Leaf Pottery of Spartanburg, SC. Each has a unique style and collectors will find beautifully-crafted functional pottery in all sizes, shapes, and colors.

Market favorite, Alex Pietersen Photography of Lake Wylie, SC, is returning with compelling black and white abstracts, which capture an obvious love of nature. Edgemoor, SC's Harmony Jewelry Design and Woodcrafts will have beaded and wire wrapped jewelry, hand painted home décor, and wreaths. If your holiday shopping list includes handcrafted soaps or candles, two artisans, new to the show, will have what you seek!
