Tiger Strikes Asteroid Greenville (TSA GVL) was founded in 2019 and is the newest part of the Tiger Strikes Asteroid (TSA) network of artist-run spaces and joins locations in Philadelphia, New York, Los Angeles, and Chicago. Our goal is to collectively bring people together, expand connections and create community through artist-initiated exhibitions,

projects, and curatorial opportunities. We seek to build an ethos of cooperative achievement in the visual arts, creating the physical and emotional space for artists to show their work and exchange ideas on their own terms. Our artist-run model expands the artist's role beyond that of studio practitioner to include the roles of curator, critic, and community developer and provides an alternate model to the conventions of the current commercial art market. TSA GVL will specifically focus on connecting the art communities in Greenville and the greater Southeast to the global art world. TSA was founded in 2009 in Philadelphia, is a 501c3 non-profit organization, and is a 2021 recipient of a grant from the Warhol Foundation.

Art Center of Greenwood in Greenwood, SC, Features Works by Greenwood Clay Community - May 7, 2022


Earth into Art... A Greenwood Clay Community is an event created by Greenwood Area Studio Potters (GASP) to promote the culture and craft of pottery in the South Carolina Heritage Corridor. It spotlights the evolution of ceramics in Greenwood where networking and professional development have expanded educational opportunities and studios locally.

This event is a collaborative sale and educational event between GASP, The Art Center of Greenwood, and Boys & Girls Clubs of the Lakelands Starz24 Teen Center. It will be held on Saturday, May 7, 2022, from 9am - 5pm at The Art Center of Greenwood in Greenwood, SC.

Included in the May 7th event is a display and sale of pottery created by the teens of the Boys & Girls Club with the support of GASP members and The Art Center. As in the previous year's sale, there will be wheel throwing demonstrations, tours of the studios in The Art Center, and opportunities to "feel" the clay process.

Children in attendance will have the chance to win a scholarship for The Art Center's Summer Clay Camp. All recommended safety precautions will be in place. Masks, if required, will be available; hand sanitizer will be in many locations throughout; guests will be spaced and limited in the
